



What to do When 9-1-1

- The 9-1-1 operator will ask you questions to find out what type of help you need. What is your location? What is your phone number? What is the emergency? What is your name?
- Remember to stay calm and speak slowly.
- Tell the 9-1-1 operator what's wrong and where you need help.
- Speak up loud and clear when being asked questions.
- Stay on the phone until the 9-1-1 operator tells you it's ok to hang up.

What not to do When Calling 9-1-1

- If you call by mistake, stay on the line and tell the 9-1-1 operator that you dialed wrong.
- Do not call 9-1-1 as a joke or a prank. You can get into serious trouble. More importantly, you can delay someone else getting the help they need in an emergency.
